Question: Ensuring quality education for all

The general assembly,

Remembering that the 26's article of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights of United Nations signed in 1948 noted that :

Declaring that everyone has the right to education. Education must be free [...]. Elementary education is compulsory. Technical, vocational and higher education must be accessible in full equality to all on the basis on their merit,

Declaring that education should aim at the full development of the human personality respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms. It must promote understanding, tolerance and friendship among all mankind, as well as the promotion of peace through the activities of the United Nations.

*Noting* with consternation a limited access to a qualitative education in some countries of which Malala Yousafzai was a victim,

Knowing that according to our goals, a qualitative education allows spiritual elevation, an access to a worldwide culture, countries development and that "UNESCO's activities encompass the development of education from preschool to higher education, including technical and vocational education and training, non-formal education and literacy",

*Expressing* our worries about noticing that "244 million children and youth are still out of school for social, economic and cultural reasons" according to our investigations, especially in middle east where some new governments decided to ban women from education even if their school integration had been improved in the 2000s,

*Emphasizing* our convention against discrimination in education of 1960 which is supposed to ensure "equivalent standards of education in all public educational institutions of the same level and conditions in relation to quality" in all the 109 states that have signed it,

Observing the main function of the UNESCO, articulated in two kay idea:

- a) *To contributes* to peace and security by international cooperation in education, sciences, culture, communication and information,
- b) *To promotes* knowledge sharing and the free flow of ideas to accelerate mutual education and collective security,

- 1. *Deploring* the lack of access to a legal education in some countries especially in Sahel where a lot of childs are studying in illicit schools because of conflicts and tensions;
- 2. Notices proudly that, since 2015, Unesco's program for education for all is seriously concerned by sustainable development program of the United Nations ODD 2030;
- 3. Congratulates of being the ODDS4 commission for ensuring quality education for all;
- 4. Hopes the continuity of the efficiency of our actions for education;
- 5. Encourages the members of UNESCO to keep the responsibility to protect one of the fundamental human rights which is a free and equal education for all because what is established is not necessarily acquired;
- 6. *Supports* the engagement of a discussion from developed countries in terms of education with some governments that are more late to create new schools on their land;
- 7. Promotes financial help for countries that don't have the necessary funds to ensure at least primary and secondary school by releasing 100 million dollars from our monetary funds:
- 8. *Expresses* its objective of reaching a quota of at least 150 countries that are signatories to the convention against discrimination in education;
- 9. *Spurs* peacemaking missions by our blue helmet troops in conflict areas because education must be built in a climate of peace;
- 10. Decides to make education compulsory in all signatory countries of convention;
- 11. *Envisages*, accordingly, to establish economic sanctions adapted to the means of the state in the event of non-fulfilment of the obligation.
