QUESTION : What are the solutions that allow us to prevent violence against girls ?

SOUMIS PAR : Indonesia

The General Assembly,

Recalling that the preamble to the Charter of the United Nations declares “to reaffirm faith in fundamental human rights, in the dignity and worth of the human person, and in the equal rights of men and women,”

Taking note of Article 55 on international cooperation of the Charter of the United Nations, which guarantees “universal respect for and observance of human rights and fundamental freedoms for all without distinction as to sex,”

Reaffirming, according to Article 3 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, that in decisions concerning children, whether made by public or private social welfare institutions, courts, administrative authorities or legislative bodies, the best interests of the child must be a primary consideration.

Considering the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women in Law, Social Practices and in Public/Private Institutions, adopted in 1979 by the General Assembly,

Aware of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action presented in 1995, which endorses the commitment of States to guarantee the fundamental rights of women and girls, to combat all forms of violence, to ensure their full and equal participation in political, economic and social life, and to integrate gender equality into all public policies.

Concerned by current geopolitical issues that are creating inequalities between men and women, leading to increased violence against women and resulting in unequal access to resources,

1. *Highlights* the commitment of various governmental and non-governmental organizations and associations to the fight for the rights of girls and women;
2. *Calls* on all States, in accordance with the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, to update their legislation regarding gender equality between men and women to avoid any discrimination or misunderstanding;
3. *Calls* on all States to become involved in the cause of women to enable girls around the world to enjoy the same rights as boys by raising awareness of gender equality through educational, awareness-raising and prevention projects in particular;
4. *Requests* that States exposed to one or more geopolitical instabilities, such as armed conflicts, implement physical and economic measures to ensure the safe placement of girls and women, who are particularly affected by these instabilities :
 - a) Infrastructure made available to accommodate these women and their children, if they have any;
 - b) economic support measures for women in precarious situations to offer them a potential way out;
 - c) the establishment of supervised transportation routes to ensure safe and secure travel for these women;
 - d) the deployment of qualified medical personnel providing rapid and free access to first aid, supplemented by psychological support to help women cope with trauma.
