problématique : How sexual violence affects young girls ?

General Assembly

*Convinced* that women deserve the same treatment as men and that they should not suffer repression which men do not face,

*Declaring* that Freedom of speech is a fundamental right protected by Article 19 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and Article 19 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR),

*Alarmed* by the fact that 29 countries still practice female genital mutilation and excision according to the data of UNICEF,

*Noting with regret* that today at least 15 million teenage girls have already experienced forced sex at some point in their lives,

*Estimating* that one in four women first experienced intimate partner violence prior to the age of 18 and 49% experienced rape as a minor according to a press from NSVRC,

*Deploring* that complications during pregnancy and childbirth are responsible for about 1 in 23 deaths worldwide among adolescents aged 15 to 19 years according to a press release from unwomen.org,

Clauses

1. *Invites* associations to raise awareness among populations of countries who practice excision about women's rights in terms of sexual and reproductive health, the issue of early pregnancies and the risks that these practices present for their health;
2. *Encourages* Member States to adopt and strengthen legal, policy, and healthcare provisions ensuring women's access to safe and lawful abortion services;
3. *Urges* countries to seriously concern themselves with the practice of excision and to give women the power to choose whether they want it or not;
4. *Call upon* an appeal to set up more services to invite girls to express themselves about the sexual violence suffered.
