The general assembly,

Keeping in mind of the 26th article of 1948 of the Universal Declaration of Human rights and it's key principle: « Everyone has the right to

education », it owes us to act upon it,

Considering the frightening data from the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) in 2018 that 1 out of 6 children in the world cannot read or write (617 million children), the need for change is becoming more and more predominant,

Remembering the shocking figure from the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) that 129 million girls world wide are out of school due to poverty, child marriage and gender-based violence, it is our duty as economically leading countries to help our population and as a whole human kind,

Aknowledging the action of the association « Let our Girls Suceed » in Kenya, where 86% of 205 girls helped by the program went on to secondary school or to a vocational training center, enabling us to carry out the torch of education,

Spotlighting Finlande's measure of April 15 2022 that enables international students to apply for residence only once for the total duration of their studies, international students are beacons of hope, especially nowadays, as they are symbols of the thirst for knowledge and are showcasing their determination to get quality education no matter what, not only does this reinforce Finland's attractivity, it is a lead we must follows, as International Organization for Immigration (IOM) Global Migration Data Analysis Center (GMBAC) based in UNESCO 2018 points out, the numbers of international students in 2016 increased up to 4.854.346. It is necessary to help them for the sake of their studies as international students are an ever growing number and willling to make sacrifices for their futurs.
