AI and education: how to guarantee equality for all in our access to AI (Artificial Intelligence) and its use?

The General Assembly,

Deeply concerned about the need of an internet development in the world, to ensure that all peoplewill have access to more information and can fully engage with AI technology, which is currently not accessible in many developing countries,

Encourages the advancement of AI in developing countries to facilitate the education of children who lack access to formal education, and to restore equality between them and children in more developed countries,

Accepts the responsibility of introducing young children to the use of AI, as it would otherwise be ineffective to develop AI technology without preparing future generations to the use of it.

Desiring financial assistance from developed countries to help achieve the development and integration of AI in developing countries,

Expresses hope that AI will bring significant positive changes to the education system in developing countries, improving both the quality of education and the economic prospects of smaller countries,

Desiring equality of opportunity between the two genders will be efficient to provide the exact same education to boys and girls in our schools,

- 1) *Confirms* the undertaking of large-scale efforts to expand the internet network across the entire world, ensuring accessibility for all people, even the ones living in retreated areas;
- 1) *Takes responsibility* for initiating young children into the world of AI, through:
 - 1.a) The creation of specialized AI educational programs in schools,
 - 1.b) Recruitment of AI-trained educators,
 - 1.c) Investment in computers and technology infrastructure for schools to facilitate AI education;
- 1) *Envisages* to make a campaign to incite families to let their daughters go to school and have an education as they do for their sons;

- 1) *Recognizes that* the success of this plan requires significant financial support from wealthier nations, and stresses that without this aid, the project would be impossible to achieve;
- 1) *Encourages* developed countries to support small countries efforts, as it is in their mutual interest:
 - 1.a) Giving a financial support,
 - 1.b) Cultivating a more informed and educated population.
