QUESTION : Prevent violence against girls

SUBMITTED BY : The Greece  
United Nations' General Assembly,

*Remembering* the United Nations' Security Council adopted the Resolution 1325 on the October 31st 2000 to start the action plan called Security and Peace for Women's Program, to end the conflicts which women are victims and to include them in the Peace plan,

*Highlighting* the establishment of the Istanbul Convention, signed and ratified in 2011 to prevent and to fight against domestic violence towards women by setting up support groups for victims and by educating children from a very young age to be attentive to violence, then this Convention allows women to be more protected facing violence,

*Reaffirming* the creation of the international day established in France and first created in Latin America to eliminate violence against girls every November 25th,

*Recognizing* the strengthening of the law adopted on the July 9th 2010 in France which allows for faster punishment of offenders and greater support for victims,

*Observing* the efforts made by the UN Women to help the victims with a commission that lasts ten days and brings together member states every year to make a point about this subject,

1. *Condemn* every culpable person of physical violence, whatever the form, the condition or the context, to be judged and to be condemned more quickly and more severely with, as example a three year sentence by the government of each state and to strengthen laws about physical violence by increasing the sentences.

2. *Encourage* States to instaurate prevention's campaign financed by associations which are supporting these causes in schools at the beginning of learning to read and to understand the issues, as example by making a slogan as "For the pain and the blood, we already have our menstrual cycle." it helps to defend victims of physical violence which would be known by everyone.

3. *Instaurate* support groups to help the victims rebuild their lives and regain their self confidence by creating meetings with mental health professionals and the former victims in

order to discuss about their experience and their feelings.
