



## UN WOMEN

**Topic :** "PREVENT VIOLENCE AGAINST GIRLS"

The general assembly,  
Guided by the principles of the Charter of the United Nations,

*Reaffirming* the importance of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the Convention on the Rights of the Child,

*Recognizing* that violence against girls is a global issue affecting all regions regardless of culture or level of development,

*Emphasizing* the importance of respecting national sovereignty, cultural diversity, and religious values when implementing gender-related policies,

*Acknowledging* ongoing national efforts under Saudi Vision 2030 to enhance women's participation in education, employment, and public life,

Deeply concerned by the persistence of child marriage, human trafficking, online violence, and exploitation of girls, particularly in conflict and crisis situations,

1. *Encourages* Member States to strengthen family-based and community-based approaches to prevent violence against girls, including:
  - a. *Promoting* awareness campaigns aligned with cultural and religious values;
  - b. *Encouraging* the positive role of religious and community leaders in condemning violence;
  
2. *Calls* for enhanced educational opportunities for girls, by:
  - a. *Expanding* access to quality primary and secondary education;
  - b. *Integrating* values-based education promoting mutual respect and dignity;
  
3. *Urges* international cooperation to combat human trafficking and exploitation, through:
  - a. *Strengthening* border controls and international information-sharing mechanisms;

- b. *Supporting* joint regional initiatives to dismantle trafficking networks;
  - c. *Providing* technical assistance to developing countries upon request;
  
- 4. *Encourages* the development of safe reporting mechanisms that:
  - a. *Protect* the confidentiality and dignity of child victims;
  - b. *Provide* access to psychological and medical support services;
  - c. *Operate* in accordance with national legal frameworks;
  
- 5. *Supports* responsible digital governance to address online violence, including:
  - a. Cooperation with technology companies to prevent harmful digital content;
  - b. *Respecting* national legislation in the regulation of online platforms;
  
- 6. *Calls* for the protection of girls in conflict zones, by:
  - a. *Strengthening* humanitarian assistance focused on women and children;
  - b. *Supporting* reintegration programs for survivors of exploitation;
  - c. *Encouraging* peaceful resolution of conflicts as a fundamental means of protection;
  
- 7. *Invites* UN Women and relevant UN agencies to provide technical support to Member States, upon request, in developing culturally appropriate strategies to eliminate violence against girls.
