Question: Ensuring quality education for all

Remembering that many countries ratified the Universal Declaration of Human Rights which ensures every person to have the right to an equal and free education,

Reminding that UNESCO made a convention against discrimination in education which ensures equivalent standards of education in all public educational institutions of the same level and conditions in relation to quality and came into effect in 1962,

Declaring concern about the large number of children who don't have access to school. Between 34% to 46% children can't perceive an education,

Thanking the 109 states who have ratified this convention,

Aware about the difficulties that some less developed and poorer countries have to invest in schools, some countries from the Sahel clearly illustrate how humanitarian emergencies and protracted crises keep children out of school,

Emphasizing there is a profound violation of human dignity and of fundamental right to education in some countries when they bar women and girls from receiving an education, which violates the fundamental right of girls to education,

- 1. Inviting the 82 countries who don't ratified the convention to ratified it,
- 2. Asking to keep and protect the fundamental right to education, with free and equal education for everyone, by respecting the Universal Declaration of Human Rights,
- 3. Request quality and equal education for everyone, by asking developed countries to help less developed and poorer countries financially with the help from the Official Development Assistance (OAD),
- 4. Claiming every children can have the opportunity to have access to school, by helping them financially with scholarships, or by letting countries invest

themselves into UNESCO's Global Education Coalition which is a platform for collaboration and exchange to protect the right to education,

5. Asking to respect the convention made by UNESCO against discrimination in education which ensures free and compulsory education, promotes equality of educational opportunity, and bans any forms of discrimination.
