Bearing in mind that they are actors in peacekeeping operations, peacekeepers are multinational forces composed of national personnel under the authority of the United Nations. They are made up of civilians, military and police forces. The Blue Helmets embody the presence of the international community in a conflict area. Their mission is not to directly interfere in conflicts, although they may use force to defend themselves.

Noting with regret that the results show that since 2000, PKOs please write it in full form have become increasingly dangerous for peacekeepers, police and civilian personnel such as the ONUC in the Congo, UNPROFOR in the former Yugoslavia or Somalia.

More recently, the interventions in Mali in the Timbuktu region, have resulted in 261 deaths since 2013.

Bearing in mind UN General Assembly Resolution 43.131 of 1988 and the more than 300 Security Council resolutions on the right to interfere that have been enshrined by the World Summit of Heads of Government.

Underlining the failure to address the many challenges, the need to redefine humanitarian assistance seems to be the major challenge.

- 1 Request the revision of human rights and in particular the rights of minorities, which are often sidelined. And thus reaffirming the principles of humanity, neutrality, impartiality and independence in the provision of humanitarian assistance.
- 2 Encourages therefore the intervention of the ambassadors of the member countries of the Security Council with the government of the state in question before any intervention. That is, as soon as any discrimination appears.
- 3 Invites the establishment of an international committee to investigate the protection of minorities in countries suspected of discriminating against their minorities
