**QUESTION**: Working together to apply the responsibility to protect

**SUBMITTED BY:** Brazil

The Security Council,

Considering that each state has to protect its citizens regardless of their ethnicity, language or religion (without making any differences between (any) humans,)

Taking into account that acting with the right to intervene can be challenging, as the five permanent members of the Security Council must agree on the ways to act, while being able to as they can use their veto for on any decision,

Reaffirming the two concepts of States sovereignty introduced by Kofi Annan in 1992, seeing sovereignty not only as a right, but also as a duty, which this makes the members of the Security Council commit more to the Responsibility to protect than to the Right to intervene,

*Emphasizing* the numerous challenges of the 1990's and the Security Council's failure to resolve them, the need to reconceptualize humanitarian help appears to the international community as the main priority,

- 1. Request the review of the rights of minorities as they always come after human rights, includes reconceptualizing the humanitarian help charter to put the fate of minorities as a central spot in it,
- 2. Engage the debate with the aim of instauring a specific process for each case, including debates and gathering between States and the UN, before the possibility of an actual conflict,
- Declare itself ready to intervene with a military intervention of the United Nation troops in case of the universal periodic review fail to make the difference diplomatically,

Decides to remain actively seized of the issue.
