QUESTION: Ensuring quality education for all.

SUBMITTED BY: Greece

General assembly,

*Alarmed that*, Greece's spending on education is lower than in most other European countries,

*Recognizing*, the efforts made by the Greek authorities to improve the quality and equity of the national education system, through innovative measures combined with deep structural reforms,

*Taking into account*, the help of Brussels, our Embassy of Greece whose main mission is to ensure that the interests and policies of the country are defended as effectively as possible in the European Union,

*Deploing*, the percentages of children without access to primary education are nearly 2 out of 5 children, or 18 million, are not enrolled in school,

*Noting with concern that in 2015*, humanitarian organizations received only 31% of the education funding they needed, far behind the 66% obtained 10 years earlier. Despite a 126% increase in educational needs since 2005, funds have increased by only 4%,

1. *Requires that*, all children entering school age have the same right to be educated regardless of their social background;

2. *Congratulates himself*, the advice given to the government of countries where the issue of education is highly controversial, on investment and access to it for all;

3. *Hopes*, for a major increase in investment in education;

4. *Considering*, that 40% of the world's population does not have access to education in the language she speaks or understands best;

5. *In addition*, meeting the educational needs of all with equitable access to knowledge and life skills programs current;

6. *Declares itself ready*, to create a working group and to take its lead with the participation of voluntary States as well as an NGO concerned with the subject.
