QUESTION : Ensuring quality education for all

SUBMITTED BY : Sweden

The General Assembly,

*Noting with great concern* the figures of children without access to education in some countries, having studied these figures, I found approximately 250 million young people between the ages of 6 and 18 were not in school in 2020 worldwide,

*Realizing* that of these 250 million young people without education, more than half live in fear. Whether it is because of conflicts such as the one in South Sudan where one in three schools is closed because classes could not be held under these conditions, or destroyed by bombs,

*As a result*, children were not enrolled in these schools can no longer attend them and therefore cannot receive the education they need,

*Nothing* also that 6 out 10 children, or 617 million worldwide, do not reach the minimum inequalities between young people,

*Underlining with regret* the gender inequalities from the earlier age, particularly with regret for the right of girls to go to school in some countries. This is a significant consequence to be addressed to increase education among young people, All children should therefore be allowed to go to school and have the right to the same education. In this case, the inequality significantly affects the chances of success of future adults,

*Concerned about* the issue of poverty in the world which greatly and inevitably affects both developed and underdeveloped countries. As a result, almost 389 million people live in extreme poverty. Parents are forced to send their children to work. Among them, 73 million work in the most dangerous jobs. In mines, child soldiers or victims of prostitution. All of these jobs greatly reduce their chances of getting education, but also hinder their development.

*Emphasizing again by deploring* the working conditions of some children. By being forced to work, these children are deprived of the freedom to choose their future, but they can be subjected to violence, whether physical, moral or sexual, with, as highlighted earlier, children being victims of prostitution. Health with possible injuries and harmful working conditions that a child should not be subjected to,

*Bearing in mind* that too many children in the world do not have access to education, let us therefore act together to promote access to education for all,

1. *Let us* ask countries that have the capacities to receive young people who do not have access to education for reasons of conflicts or other reasons in their own country to come and study so that they can have the same right to a future as other children in privileged countries and finally to guarantee them security;
2. *Set up* funds to help countries in need is that do not have the financial and/or material resources to build schools;
3. *Express concern* that many children cannot go to school because of insecurity on the way. Rape and kidnapping of children on their way to school is not acceptable in 2023 Therefore, propose to strengthen security in the countries concerned to ensure better security for children to go to school safely ;
4. *Declare it is readiness* to help countries in extreme poverty to reduce as much as possible the forced labor of children that prevents them from having the right to an education and thus a future on the same level as other young people;

*Decides to remain actively seized of the issue.*
