Topic : ensuring quality education for all

Bearing in mind the second Millennium Development Goal announced in 2000 which is to achieve universal primary education and the third goal which is to promote gender equality,

Viewing with appreciation the creation of the Global Citizenship Education program that promotes peace and the respect of human rights, especially in countries where poverty and inequalities threaten the peace,

Approving the Education for Sustainable Development program which builds the capacities of educators, promotes local level actions, empowers and mobilizes youth to fight against Climate Change,

Alarmed by the 771 millions young people and adults who lacks basic literacy skills (two thirds of them are women),

Fully Aware that 200 billion US dollars are needed annually to get the world on track to achieve the Sustainable Development Goal 4 by 2030,

Bearing in mind that the education's quality (teacher's qualifications, equipments, infrastructures) is unequal between developed countries and developing countries,

Noting with deep concern that millions of children are affected by school-related gender-based violence (SRGBV),

1. *Encourages* the creation of a platform fostering the exchanges between a school of a poor country and a school of a rich country, between a school which wants to help and a school which needs help, so that the school which wants to help can share informations, give equipments that they don't use anymore; it would also create a bond between students from different countries and be culturally and humanely enriching for both schools,
2. *Requests* an increase of UNESCO's budget dedicated to education in order to successfully complete all the projects and operations, and create more ambitious ones to ensure quality education for all,
3. *Recommends*, on January 24th, which is the international day for the education, the creation of many events worldwide such as charitable festivals, lotteries and sport events to raise as many funds as possible,
4. *Reaffirms* the importance of raising awareness about gender based discriminations and violence at school,
5. *Demands* the creation of a free online formation for teachers and educators in at least the 10 most spoken languages in order to give them all the ressources, tools

and methods to teach children and young people about gender based stereotypes, discriminations, and violence,

6. *Suggests* the creation of a prize to reward the best local, national or international initiative aiming to eradicate gender based violences and discriminations,
