Russian Attack Leaves Over a Million in Ukraine Without Electricity

A Russian missile and drone attack on power plants and energy infrastructure in Ukraine has caused blackouts for over a million people. At least five people were killed and 26 injured. The Kremlin has escalated its rhetoric over the conflict, claiming Russia is in a state of war due to the West's heavy involvement.

The Ukrainian Air Force reported that Russia launched 63 Iranian-made "Shahed" attack drones and 88 missiles in the assault. The Russian government claims that missiles have no delays, unlike aid packages for Ukraine.
