Elon Musk's Starship rocket goes further and higher

SpaceX reports significant progress in Starship's development after a second test flight in Texas. The 120m-tall rocket showed improvements from its explosive April debut, attaining greater altitude. Despite an early termination due to technical issues, fixes were evident. NASA praised SpaceX's efforts, recognizing it as a learning opportunity. Starship aims to support Moon missions and revolutionize space travel with reusability, carrying capacity, and cost reduction. Belgium dominated in Euro 2024 qualifying, with Romelu Lukaku scoring four goals in the first half against Azerbaijan. Lukaku, now boasting 83 goals in 113 games, became the seventh highest scorer in men's international football. His exceptional performance, supported by England-based players, secured a 5-0 victory. This win solidified Belgium's top spot in Group F, securing their place in the tournament, while maintaining an undefeated streak since coach Domenico Tedesco took charge in February.

Hunt does not rule out income tax cuts *BBC*, Nov 17th


