Apple lays off 600 workers in California after shuttering self-driving car project

In a consolidation move, Apple cut 600 jobs in Santa Clara, shifting from electric cars to AI. Other tech giants such as Amazon, Electronic Arts, Sony, Cisco Systems, and Snap also implemented layoffs, reflecting cost-cutting amid slower growth. These actions highlight current challenges in the tech industry, where companies are adjusting strategies to adapt to new market realities and streamline operations.

New York and beyond rattled by rare East Coast earthquake

A magnitude-4.8 earthquake struck near Lebanon, New Jersey, causing tremors felt from Pennsylvania to Connecticut, as reported by local residents. Experts suggest the quake may have occurred along reactivated fault lines, with a low risk of aftershocks.

Museums are becoming more expensive

The debate over museum admission fees has intensified as major institutions like MoMA have raised ticket prices to \$30, citing increased operational costs post-COVID-19. This trend raises concerns about accessibility and the potential alienation of younger and more diverse audiences. Although ticket sales contribute minimally to a museum's overall revenue, with the bulk coming from donations and government support, the principle of free or affordable access is under scrutiny. Critics argue that higher fees conflict with the mission of museums to be accessible to all, fearing that the move towards higher costs could exacerbate the decline in museum attendance. The challenge lies in balancing financial sustainability with the imperative to keep art and culture within everyone's reach.
